

Illustration of using a Rounded V or an Omega Blade

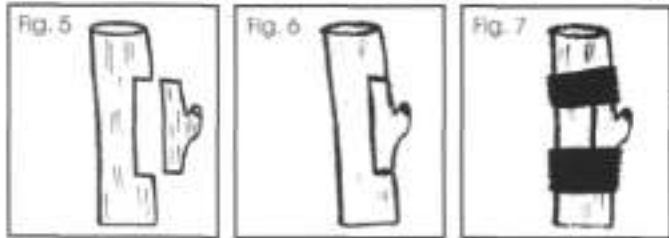
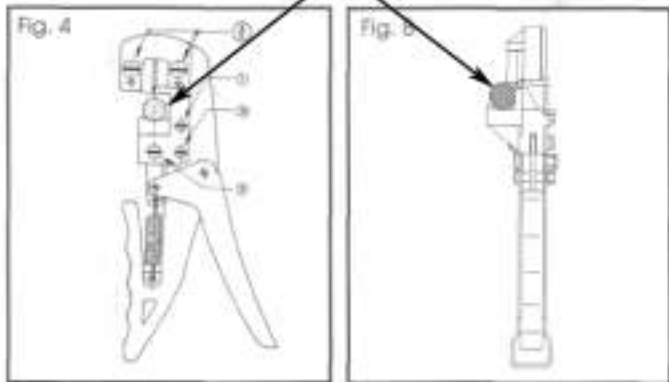
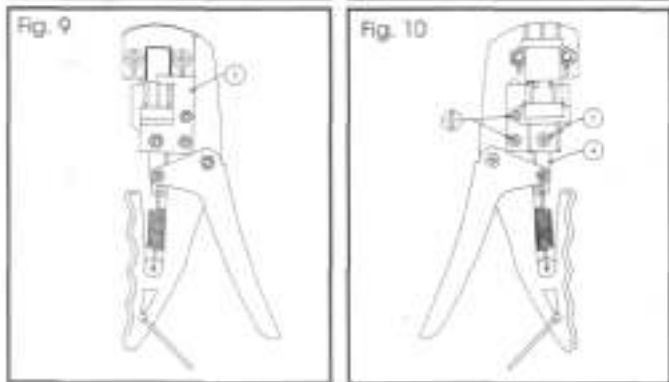


Illustration of using a Chip Budding Blade

This round circle represents the branch you are cutting.



The picture on the left is showing you how the branch is to be positioned if you are using either a Rounded V or an Omega blade. It is Fig. 4. With this blade you cut the end off of the stock plant and the donor plant (scion) and put the two together. This is illustrated in Fig. 1, 2, and 3 at the top of this page.



The picture on the right is showing you how the branch is to be positioned if you are using the Chip Budding blade. It is Fig. 8. With this blade you cut a chip out of the stock plant, and a bud off of the donor plant, and put the bud from the donor plant into the chip of the stock plant. This is illustrated in Fig. 5, 6, and 7 at the top of this page.
